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Object Lesson

Preparation:

- -Arrange the children in a circle.
- -Rock-a Bye-Baby song
- two dolls

1 doll as the hurt man and 1 doll to play the part of the good Samaritan.

Point the children to God, then give the Holy Spirit room to minister through you.

(15 minutes)

Hi children! Can you give a friend a hug today? (Wait for children to hug). Would you like to sing a song? My friend here (doll on lap) loves to sing to Jesus, I do too.

(sing Rock-a Bye-Baby two times)

Say with me: Love comes from God. Very good!

You know children, Jesus told the story of a man who was filled with God's love.

The Bible calls this man the good Samaritan. This man was filled with love and *love comes from God*.

Love makes you do good things. The good Samaritan, helped a man that was very hurt. One day a man was traveling to a city, (move doll as if walking), when all of the sudden! The man was hurt by mean bandits.

The man was very hurt (rest doll on lap). Then two other men passed by but did not help the hurt man. (sad face) But wait! The good Samaritan (doll #2) — He passed by and saw the hurt man, then he took a closer look, and quickly started to help him. (doll #2 helps hurt doll) He wanted to make the hurt man feel better. God's love was inside this man! Yay!!

Teaching Tips

- <u>Infants and toddlers learn through play.</u> Use the toys available in the classroom to make the lesson more meaningful.
- <u>Be creative! Do not be embarrassed to make noises, use strange voices</u> <u>and funny facial expressions.</u> This will help the infants and toddlers make a connection with you and the lesson.
- Remember that your teaching does make a difference in these children's lives. <u>God's Word never comes back void.</u>
- <u>Lean on your Junior Helpers!</u> They can be of great help by redirecting the children to the lesson while you teach.
